To be eligible for any of these pilot scholarships, the applicant must:

Intend to pursue a professional aviation career	Be at least 16 years of age
Hold a current Airman Certificate ** (copy required)	Demonstrate a financial need
Hold a current Medical Certificate (copy required)	Demonstrate exceptional scholastic ability
Have accumulated total flight time of <u>100 hours</u>	Have a current Biennial Flight Review **
to be eligible for the Advanced & Instrument	Use the scholarship funds within one year
scholarships, <u>10 hours</u> for the Primary	Be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident
Training Scholarship	Be a resident of a New England state in the US.
Start the training at a New England Facility doing business as a Flight School	

** = except for Primary Training

Criteria for judging applications include:

- Financial need.
- Ability to meet the planned aviation goals as shown by recommendations and academic records.
- Aviation activities (flying, model building, science projects, aviation employment and the like) as described in the personal letter and recommendations.

1. APPLICATION

Be sure you have completed and **signed** the application form.

2. TRANSCRIPTS

Please attach a copy of all transcripts (high school, technical, vocational, military, or college) of school records.

3. CITIZENSHIP

Please attach a copy of your birth certificate, passport, or permanent resident card, if applicable.

4. PERSONAL LETTER

Please attach a personal letter giving your reasons for selecting a professional aviation career path. Do include descriptions of your aviation related activities, with emphasis on what means the most to you. Discuss how you would use the scholarship to attain your career goals. What future employment do you plan to pursue? Do you have any extracurricular activities, hobbies, and interests? Personal letter should be limited to one page.

5. FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Show your expenses this past year and expenses estimated for this year, on the form provided. This includes school fees, rent, food, car insurance, health insurance, gas, etc. Then list your sources of income for the next year. This includes anticipated loans, scholarships, financial aid, help from family, etc. List separately your anticipated aviation education expenses. This includes plane rental, instruction fees, tests, texts, etc. This financial outline **must** be as comprehensive as possible because the first criterion for consideration is need.

6. RECOMMENDATIONS

Please have two people who know you well, excluding relatives, write letters of recommendation. One of these persons must be familiar with your flying skills and your aviation skills and activities. The other person should be someone who knows you well enough to discuss you as an individual. Include the letters with this application package if possible or have them sent to the same address. Letters from teachers or employers are preferred. Recommendations should be no more than one page.

7. FLIGHT RECORDS

Include in your application package a photocopy of **only** the most recent two pages of your personal logbook, your FAA medical, and airman certificates.
